have been onboard His Majesty's Ship Rainbow
and with the assistance of the Surgeon of the
Hospital and our respective Surgeons, have
made a strict and careful examination
into the state of Captain Guion's health
and find as follows Viz —

That he is at times subject to a
pulmonary complaint in consequence of
a severe attack of inflammation of the
Breast, with which he was affected about
Six Months ago. and we are of opinion that
a change of climate is absolutely necessary
to the reestablishment of his health —




Having received the enclosed orders from

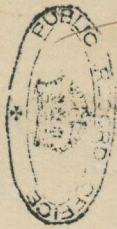

By Edward Codrington Esq: Captain
of His Majesty's Ship Blake and
Senior Officer on the Coast of
Cataluña.

His Excellency the Baron of Proles being
appointed by the Captain General of Cataluña
to proceed to Majorca to make some very
important communications to the Marquis
of Caspigny;
You are hereby directed to receive
him on board His Majesty's Ship under your Com-
mand with his suite, and conduct him to
Palma in Majorca with all possible expedi-
tion. - If you find that the stay of the Baron
is likely to detain you many days, you will
endeavor to procure him the means of
returning in whatever vessel of war may be
in that Port; so as to enable you to resume
your station on this coast immediately.

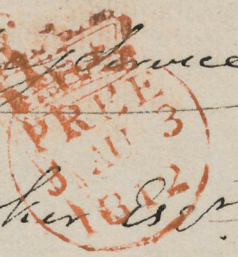

Hamble near Southampton.

Aug^t 18th 1812

Sir

When in the Mediterranean, I had the honor to reply to their Lordships order & state my expenses keeping a Table for His Excellency the Spanish Ambassador to Court of Sicily, with his suite on board His Majesty's ship Phoenix in the month of July 1811. from Mahon to Cadix by order of Admiral Fremantle - and for the Sheik Bedreddin Turkish messenger from Gibraltar to Malta in the month of August 1811 - by order of Commodore Penrose by whom the documents were transmitted to your Lordships - but finding my statement has not been received at the Admiralty I request you will have the goodness to state to their Lordships that I was put to the inconvenience of lying and sleeping on deck all the passage from Mahon to Cadix - and at the expense of one hundred and fifty pounds - and I estimate my expense for the Sheik from Gibraltar to Malta at fifty pounds - which I request
